map	A detailed drawing of an area of land, showing its shape and features as it would look if you saw it from above.
fieldwork	Looking at things outside (in the environment) where it naturally lives or occurs, rather than in a classroom.
plan view	What something looks like from above.
aerial photograph	A photo taken from the air, looking down.
directions	Instructions that tell you how to do something or how to get somewhere.
route	A way from one place to another.
key	An explanation of the symbols used in
locate	If you locate something, you find out where it is. That is its location.
city	A city is a large place where many people live and work. It has a lot of shops and facilities. A city is larger than villages and towns.
countryside	Land away from towns and cities. The countryside has farms and people enjoy walking and doing outdoor lei-

- Bradford
- Bradford is our **city**. In **north of England**.
 - There is **countryside** around Bradford.
 - Inland** = **not near the coast**.
 - City** centre has more **human features** (Alhambra Theatre, Bradford City Hall, City Park and Bradford Media Museum)
 - Countryside** has more **physical features**.

- Bierley and Keelham
- St. John's is in **Bierley** which is in **Bradford**.
 - Keelham** is also in Bradford. It is in the countryside, away from the city.
 - Some **similarities**- they have houses, roads and bus stops, both hilly
 - Some **differences**- Keelham has more fields, farms and vegetation and Bierley has more buildings, shops and larger, busier roads with more cars.
